

Anne Sophie Luong was born in 2004 in Bad Homburg v. d. Höhe and started playing the Violin at the age of 6. Until 2017 she was taught by Prof. Yvonne Smeulers at Dr. Hoch's Conservatory. Since 2018 Anne Sophie studies in Prof. Susanne Stoodt's Violin class as a Junior Student and is currently a member of the Young Academy at Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst in Frankfurt am Main.

Anne Sophie is the second award winner of the „International Josef Micka Violin Competition“ 2020 in Prague. She is a multiple first award winner of the competition „Jugend musiziert“ as well as first federal award winner in the categories Violin Solo (2019) and Duo Piano-Strings (2021). Thereby she has been among other things awarded special prizes from the German foundation Musikleben and Sparkasse Bremen. At the Mendelssohn-Competition 2021 she has received multiple special prizes as double Laureat-award winner.

Anne Sophie is already present at Kronberg Academy, like through her active participation in the Chamber Music project „Mit Musik – Miteinander 2021“. Moreover, together with Korean Pianist Eunsol Park and Celloist Arne Zeller, both likewise international award winners, she has founded the Piano Trio ZESA. Furthermore Anne Sophie has participated in multiple master classes, among the latter the class of Israeli Soloist Vadim Gluzman, and has been invited by Conductor and Violinist Christoph Poppen to his master class in November 2021.

The young Violinist earned scholarships of the Gertrud Assmann Foundation, the Cultural Foundation Sparkasse Hessen-Thüringen and of ZONTA Clubs of Frankfurt am Main. At the moment she is being funded by the Hermann und Dr. Irmgard Neumann Foundation, by the city of Bad Homburg and the Paul Fiderspil Foundation.
